Barry Alvarez to receive Duffy Daugherty Award

Ceremony set for April 24

As a player at Nebraska, Barry Alvarez remembers Duffy Daugherty speaking at a team banquet turned comedy hour.

Between Daugherty and Nebraska coach Bob Devaney, "they had a lot of stories and a lot of laughs, but a lot of wisdom, too," Alvarez said.

"Duffy meant a lot to Bob, and Bob meant a lot to me," Alvarez said of the late coaches, who worked together at Michigan State before Devaney turned Nebraska into a national power. "I really idolized Bob and I patterned my whole career after him."

In 1994, fresh off a Rose Bowl victory at Wisconsin, Alvarez was in East Lansing to present Devaney with the second Duffy Daugherty Memorial Award for contributions to college football. On April 24 at Eagle Eye Golf Club in Bath

Township, Alvarez will receive the award.

"I'm very honored by this because I have a lot of respect for what Duffy stood for," Alvarez said of Daugherty, who coached at Michigan State from 1947-72, the last 19 years as head coach.

Devaney, of Saginaw, joined Biggie Munn's staff in 1953 and coached Daugherty from 1954-56 before moving on to be head coach at Wyoming



Alvarez (1957-61) and Nebraska (1962-72).

The award is recognized by the College Football Hall of Fame, and past winners include coaches Munn, Bud Wilkinson, Eddie Robinson, Ara Parseghian, Paul "Bear" Bryant, Bo Schembechler, Woody Hayes, Tom Osborne, Lloyd Carr, Jim Tressel and Bobby Bowden, broadcaster Keith Jackson and former Michigan

athletic director Don Canham.

Pat Boog, chairman of the award, said Alvarez, 67, was an easy choice because he "excelled in almost every level of college athletics."

"He was an excellent player at Nebraska, he has been an assistant coach and a head coach," Boog said, "and he built the Wisconsin program into what it is today."

After turning around a downtrodden Wisconsin program and winning three Big Ten titles and three Rose Bowls, Alvarez became athletic director in 2004, retired from coaching after the 2005 season and still oversees a thriving athletic department — just as Devaney was Nebraska's athletic director from 1967-93.
